Jaak Ruus. Difficult childhood without parents in Siberia

Duration of video material: 00:04:42

Topic: Crimes against humanity - Deportation (March deportation 1949)

Connection to curriculum	Form VI "Contemporary History I – Estonia and the World in the First Half of the 20th Century"
Learning outcomes	The pupil - Draws up a timeline and explains the importance of the selected events; - Analyses the effect of the Second World War on Estonian history.
Description of method: if possible, additional materials and/or handouts of the method that can easily be adapted according to the aims of the lesson	Pupils draw up a timeline consisting of 7 events based on the story of Jaak Ruus. Time interval 1939–1957.
Evocation	Consideration of the story of Jaak Ruus. - Think which events are already familiar to you?
Thematic activities	As an individual assignment, a timeline of Estonian history is drawn up based on the story (1939–1957), on which are entered the 7 politically most important events in the pupil's opinion.
	Pupils compare the selected events in pairs and together choose the 5 most important events from the two timelines.
	Thereafter pupils gather in groups of four and in turn choose the 5 most important events

	from the selections of both pairs. The groups of four draw up their own timeline and justify their choices to the neighbouring group of four.
Summary	 The pupil reflects in writing: Which of the final 5 events coincided with the 7 that you originally selected? Do you agree with the final selection or not? Give reasons. Choose the most important event in your opinion and justify its importance in Estonian history.
